## **“HAUNTED” PLAYHOUSE HOSTS GHOST PLAY FOR HALLOWEEN**

**LAKE WORTH, Florida (October 19, 2009)** – The Lake Worth Playhouse presents a special Halloween production of the spine-chilling ghost story, **THE WOMAN IN BLACK** for two shows only. Performances take place October 30 and 31, 2009 at the Playhouse, located at 713 Lake Avenue in downtown Lake Worth.

**THE WOMAN IN BLACK** is based on the 1983 novel by Susan Hill and was adapted for the stage by Stephen Mallatratt. Following the form of the classic ghost story in the tradition of Charles Dickens, Henry James and Edith Wharton, **THE WOMAN IN BLACK** is a gripping mystery that features dynamic characters, shadowy surroundings, supernatural happenings and a chilling plot line that taps into our most primal fears. Mallatratt’s stage adaptation is the second longest running show in London and the winner of multiple awards, including the Los Angeles Times Critics Choice Award and four Drama Critics Circle Awards.

The play is set on England’s bleak East Coast in a quiet town where Mrs. Alice Drablow, a stern and cruel woman, lived and died alone. When a young Arthur Kipps, a junior solicitor, is ordered by his firm’s senior partner to travel up from London to attend her funeral and sort out her estate, his lonely task seems uncomplicated at first. He eventually discovers there are tragic secrets that lie behind the shuttered windows of Mrs. Drablow’s house. But it’s what lies beyond those windows that changes Mr. Kipp’s life forever. When he catches a glimpse of a ghostly figure at the church during the funeral, and later, in the graveyard, his pulse races and his mind fills with questions. He describes the figure as a gaunt woman with a wasted face who is dressed all in black. The locals know all too well the apparition he is describing, but they refuse to talk. Years later, Kipps rents a theatre and hires an actor to help him re-enact the ghostly event which befell him many years before. In doing so, he reasons, he will exorcise the haunting image from his mind and soul. But the results of his plan prove to be as horrifying as the experience itself.

The Playhouse production of **THE WOMAN IN BLACK** is directed by Pat Mackin and features local actors, Todd Caster and Mark Fetterly.

### **Haunted Playhouse?**

While no proof of a Playhouse haunting exists, many local patrons who have participated in Playhouse Ghost Hunts conducted by the Florida ghost team believe there is evidence of

paranormal activity within the antique walls of the 85-year-old historic building. Playhouse volunteers also claim to have seen apparitions, heard voices and experienced other unexplained ghostly phenomena, most of which they speculate is the work of the Oakley brothers, Lucien and Clarence, who originally constructed the theatre as a vaudeville house in 1924.

"I can't think of a better venue for hosting a ghost play," says Playhouse Artistic Director Jodie Dixon-Mears, "than a theatre with such a rich history, not to mention plenty of mystery!"

### **About the Playhouse**
